number which identifies its location and the letter tells you who is responsible for maintaining it. If the number begins with 'K' then the light is maintained by Ketley Parish Council and you should email the Clerk on parishderk@ketleyparishcouncil.co.uk giving the street light number eg. K001 and details of the problem for example light out, broken or dim.

If the street light number begins with any other letter eg. W., T or there is no letter at all, it is the responsibility of Telford & Wrekin Council and you will need to contact them directly on 01952 384000 or email them on highways@telford.gov.uk. Remember if you do not provide the street light number or you contact the wrong Council, it will take a lot longer to resolve the problem!

SCOOPER HEROES ...

You might not know this, but unfortunately dogs cam't pick

up after themselves and rely on their owners to bag and bin the mess they make!!!

Dog fouling is considered to be the most offensive form of littering and is not only very unpleasant to look at or step in, it is potentially dangerous with the threat of contracting Toxicariasis a very real risk to the public, especially to the young and vulnerable in our community.

Free bags are available from Ketley Community Centre and you can buy them cheaply in a wide variety of shops, supermarkets or online. So be a Scooper Hero and pick up after your dog because they can't.

ON THE BEAT...

Our local Policing team cover Ketley, Ketley Bank and Oakengates and are

GET REPORTING...

Have you downloaded the Everyday Telford app yet? If you've got a smart phone, this is a must have! You can use it to take photographs of problems in your area and quickly and easily

report the issue directly to the relevant department at Telford & Wrekin Coundl. You will receive an email

confirming that your report has been logged along with a reference to follow up if the problem is not resolved. Get the app on the Apple Store, Google Play or Windows Store. As well as environmental and highway issues, you can also report benefit fraud, taxi complaints, counterfeit goods and other Trading Standards matters.
